“Over the last few months I have been receiving messages of solidarity from all over the world and they have given me enormous strength and inspiration. This campaign made me believe in the

importance of fighting for my rights. It showed me that my life mattered and that I was not forgotten. Many of my fellow prisoners are young people like me and their circumstances are like mine. They ask me to share solidarity cards with them and they keep them as symbols of hope and encouragement. Thank you so much!”

Canada. The Grassy Narrows Youth have achieved the concession of a Care Home for survivors of the mercury poisoning in their community.

China. Yiliyasiliang Reheman is still missing. His wife Mairinsha has expressed her gratitude for the solidarity of thousands of messages bringing attention to the plight of her husband and the Uygur people.

Greece. Sarah Mardini and Sean Binder still face up to 25 years in prison for their humanitarian work on Lesvos but 729,072 messages have brought their cases to a wider audience.

Iran. Yasaman Aryani has been transferred to Evin prison with her mother Monireh Arabshahi and their prison sentences for resisting forced veiling have been reduced.
