Dear Attorney General

I am writing to ask you to review the casefile of Bernardo Caal Xol.

It is my understanding that there is no evidence against him and so all charges should be dropped.

I appeal to you to release him immediately and to start a full, prompt and impartial investigation into the case against Bernardo Caal Xol to ensure that those responsible for the false accusations are held accountable.

He has already been held in prison unfairly for two and a half years for peacefully defending the rights of Mayan Qeqchi communities concerning a hydroelectric project.

In September 2020 his sentence was declared incommutable, ruling out any chance of early release. This means that he faces a further four years in prison.
